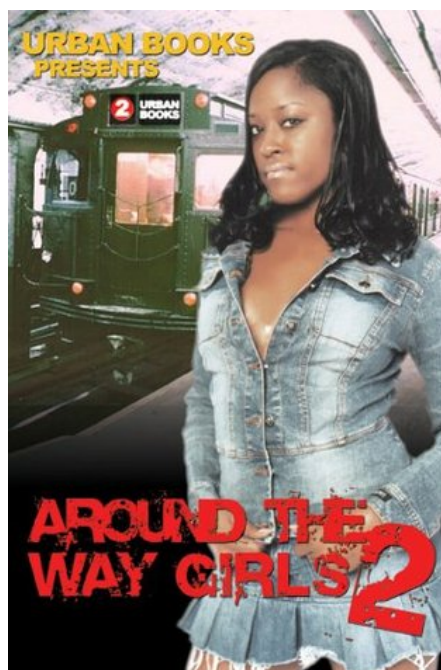




Around the Way Girls 2

Alicia, her sappy co-worker, is all gushy when it comes to her love, Omar. But as the two friends interact more on a daily basis, Lyric's mind begins to believe that maybe love is worth a chance and Alicia becomes cynical, buying into all men being dogs. Can they both be right?

As always La Jill Hunt, another of the original authors and self-appointed dramatists, invites readers to walk

on the softer side of the hood with a look at love.
