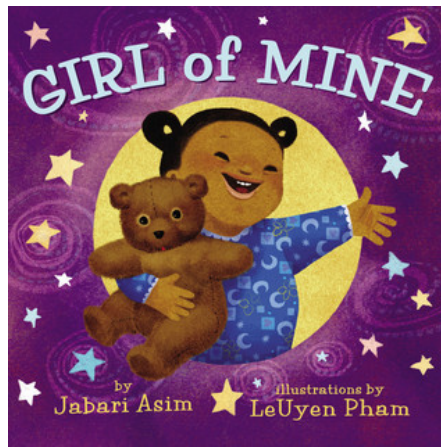




Girl of Mine

I have my usual discomfort with referring to babies as having a specific gender, 'cause at that age they don't have the cognitive capacity to have a gender and don't have the linguistic capacity to communicate it to us, but I know most people just refer to their kids by the gender assigned to them at birth -- and the title of "Girl of Mine," so it's not like anyone is picking this book up expecting it to be gender-neutral.
