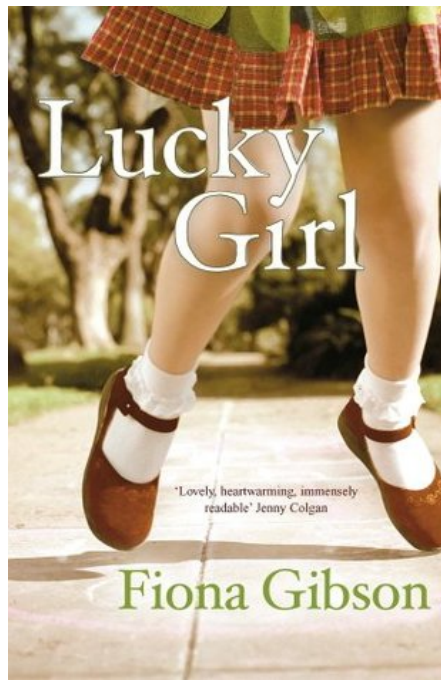




Lucky Girl
