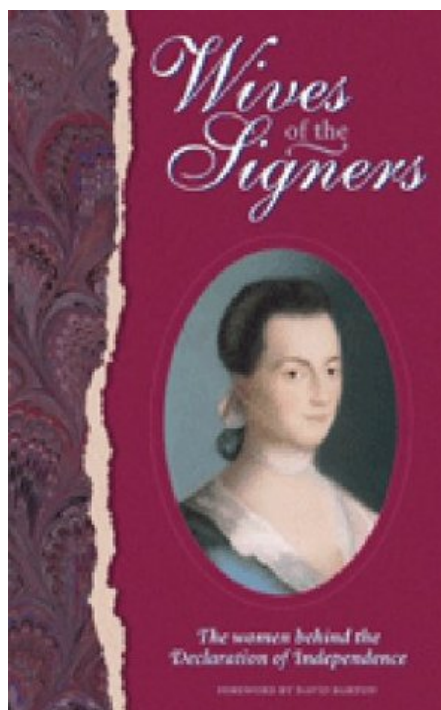




Wives of the Signers

The author provides primary source documentation when he can find it, esp. excerpts from letters which to me are some of the best parts of the book.
