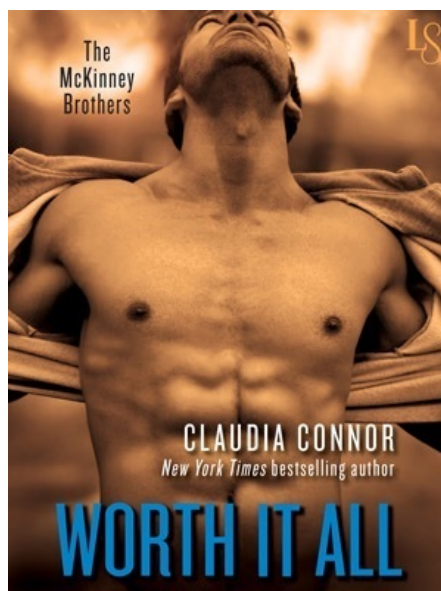

Worth it All is book three in Claudia Connor's The McKinney Brothers series. I absolutely loved the first two books in this series and was hoping that this third installment would be just as wonderful. I am happy to report that this author has penned yet another gorgeous romance that had me swooning and happily sighing. These McKinney boys are something else. ;)

This book is about Jake (JT) McKinney, the youngest of the brothers, and it also takes place quite a few years later after the first two books. Jake's life got tragically derailed when a horrific car accident not only stole his dreams of playing professional football but also caused him to lose his leg. Shortly after the accident, Jake leaves his family and starts a new life in California. While it did take time for Jake to recover, his personal trials and tribulations motivated him to become a biomedical engineer. Jake is one of the three founders of Evolution R & D, one of the most renowned prosthetic research and development companies of the world. He uses his experiences as an amputee to develop cutting edge prosthetic equipment and has devoted his life to helping other amputees recover. Despite his amazing and admiral professional accomplishments, Jake is still very much haunted by his past which is something that causes him to keep his huge and boisterous family at arm's length.

Settling down and getting married like his older brothers is something Jake knows he will never do; however, his reservations about relationships do not stop him from becoming intrigued with the beautiful waitress he sees on a regular basis at a local diner he frequents. There's just something about Paige Roberts that keeps Jake coming back and when he discovers that she is a single mother to a little girl, Casey, who is also an amputee, there is no way he could walk away now so he offers to help Casey with her prosthetic limb

that she seems to be having problems with. Paige has a lot on her plate as a single mom who is also trying to finish her schooling while providing for her daughter. The last thing she has time for is the handsome Jake McKinney who she feels is way out of her league. When he offers to help her daughter, there is no turning him down. After all, she loves Casey too much to not get her the best help possible.

Told in a dual POV, this story is definitely a slow burn as we see Paige and Jake slowly fall into each other. Both are hesitant to explore the connection that is undeniably between them. Both are also hard-pressed to stay away. The fact that Jake wants to help Casey only cements their relationship and strengthens the fragile bond that is developing not only between our two protagonists but also between Jake and Casey. I loved the natural progression of Jake and Paige's relationship. It was so well done and organic in nature. Nothing was rushed but you could not help but get caught up in all that was occurring between them.

I do enjoy it when authors add children to their romance stories, but it has to be done well as the children can often take over the story leaving the romance part falling short. Casey won me over right from the start. I could not help but fall in love with this amazing five year old who was so courageous. Jake fell into the role of surrogate father so easily and had so much love to offer. There were so many moments between him and Casey that simply clutched at my heart strings. After all, as amputees, the two of them shared a very special connection. I loved it!

The road to a happy forever was not an easy one for Jake and Paige. There were some immense obstacles that they had to overcome but, with this being stated, their journey was nothing short of beautiful. All in all, *Worth it All* was a wonderful addition to this series by Claudia Connor. It was a book that truly touched my heart as well as left me sighing happily. Although it can be read as a stand-alone, I highly recommend reading the entire series to fully understand the dynamics between the characters. This series has been a delight to read because of the family relationships and the tender romantic themes.

JT is the youngest brother in the McKinney clan. After surviving a horrific car accident, he leaves the nest and makes a life for himself in California. Although JT has established himself (in the previous books) as a cocky "know it all" football player, the trials and tribulations of his life have inspired him to change and serve others. As a biomedical engineer, he uses his experience as an amputee to develop prosthetic equipment and help other amputees in their recovery. Although JT has found financial success and he is surrounded by good friends, he has been unable to move past the demons from his past.

Paige is a struggling single mother. She is working two jobs and attending school to provide her daughter (with a disability) a better life. When JT frequents the diner that she works at, her life is changed forever.

"This was a jumping off point."

JT and Paige drawn to one another. Although both are hesitant to explore a relationship, they begin to grow closer together. The added element of Paige's sweet daughter Casey only strengthens their bond. Paige has been struggling to survive and JT offers friendship and love to both Paige and her daughter.

"You have me."

Told in dual POV, **Worth It All** is an excellent addition to this series. The characters are well developed, and the relationships between them are what keep me coming back for more. The McKinney Family is a

I also had to wait almost a year for this to be released but you can't disturb a genius. Laying it on a bit thick here I know but you get me drift.

Paige Roberts wants more in life. She's not looking for love, she just wants to look after her five year old daughter, Casey. Who, is fucking adorable and the let's face it the real star of the book. Paige works two jobs and is going to college.

Jake/JT McKinney works and basically works he isn't looking for anything serious. He has his work and Simon and that is about it.

After an accident at the age of 19 where he lost his leg and an important part of himself that he regrets to this day he thinks that he doesn't deserve to be happy or deserve a family. He works in A.I. and has created patents to help build a facility who require prosthetics.

But there is something about Paige that won't let him go.

He'd seen her five times, she'd waited on him three of those, and they'd still only exchanged a handful of words. It was just looks and smiles and for some reason that was a lot.

Jake gets furthermore involved when he sees Casey they have something very important in common.

Casey is five years old going on twenty five. She knows exactly what she wants.
