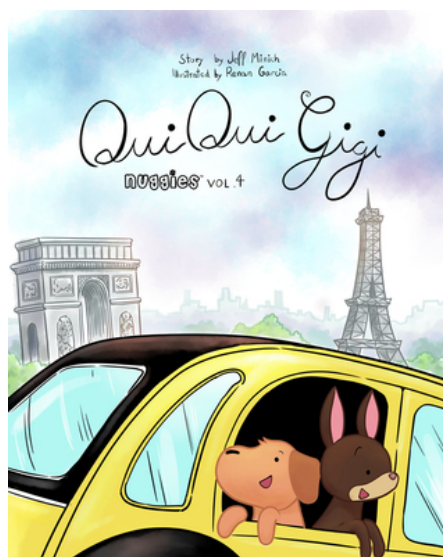




Oui Oui, Gigi!

The story is about two dogs (Nuggies) that get separated from their Dad in France. Their names are Cocoa and Chomper, and while trying to find their Dad, they find themselves being chased by a French dog catcher. Then they meet a beautiful white dog named Gigi. Gigi helps them on their quest of finding their Father, and staying clear of the dog catcher, and along the way she introduces them to some of France's history. They discover the Eiffel Tower, the Arc de Triomphe, and Notre Dame. Not only does the story introduce young children to some cultural history, but it does it in such a way that the children love it.
