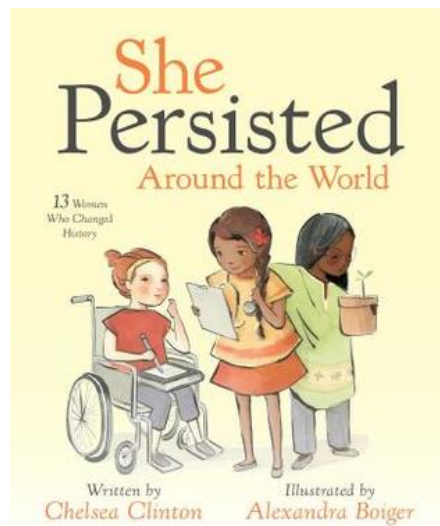




She Persisted Around the World
