Awakening is the third installation of Lalonde's *Spinward Fringe* series and follows on directly from where its predecessor, *Resurrection*, tailed off; commencing with Captain Jake Valance's search for Alice, his long-lost daughter.

After making his decision that living the life of a mercenary and contracted debt collector won't be enough to help him find Alice and unveil his forgotten past, Captain Valance follows through with his plan to take up privateering and sides with a powerful solar system in its war against Reagent Galactic; ensuring that they use their intelligence network to search for Alice while he runs riot with his crew aboard the Samson.

My Thoughts

Awakening is an exciting read right from the off and Lalonde manages to maintain the pace of the story throughout, making the book extremely difficult to put down! Furthermore, Lalonde adds a sense of sentimentality to the story that I really liked by including chapters centred around characters from the previous books, adding deep side-stories of their lives and how the loss of Jacob Valent, the captain of the First Light, effected them.

After reading *Awakening*, I would say that it fits in nicely with the previous *Spinward Fringe* stories; describing it as being innovative and packed full of the imaginative technology and real-life workings that I have come to expect from the series, making it the best and most exciting space opera that I've read to date!
