What Lysious needs is a strong editor to catch errors and inconsistencies. Writing was a bit too stiff, although it softened up a bit in the longest chapter. I believe if this work was revisited by the author as he develops as a writer, the novel would have the potential to become even greater and more fulfilling.

This book is not terrible. In fact, it has a great message and a good story. But what kept me from completely enjoying it was the writing. This book needs some editing.

There are lots of misspelled words, incorrect capitalization, and a lack of proper punctuation. The book was supposed to be in the past tense, but sometimes there were sentences in the present tense, so that threw me off some and distracted me from the story. Also, at times there were very long paragraphs, which seemed to interrupt the flow of the story.

My only other main complaint about the writing is that there is a lot of telling and not much showing. You know the writing rule, "show, don't tell"? Well, in this book there's just too much telling. When a new character is introduced, they are often described with much detail, like information about their background, or their appearance (there were a couple times when a character's height was given, which I didn't find necessary to the story).

But aside from that I did enjoy this story. It has a sweet, refreshing message to it and the ending was sad to read. I am sure the writer will only continue to improve!

This book was extremely difficult to read. There were many grammatical errors, unnecessary detail, and lack of plot development. For some reason, there was detail about the trees, however none about the development of the relationship between Henry and Naomi. They claim to 'love' each other after just meeting, and then Naomi is turned on by randoms she's not even interested in? Also, important parts, such as medical emergencies, as well as their WHOLE RELATIONSHIP were totally skimmed over. I just didn't enjoy it. The author was telling the story, rather than showing it. For such reasons, i felt no connection or empathy for the characters, and simply felt that their relationship was superficial and not real (also due to the dialogue, which i found at times over dramatic and unrealistic.) There were unnecessary characters, and many that 'would always get their way' with regards to Naomi, which usually meant beating up Henry (which was explained very very briefly).
