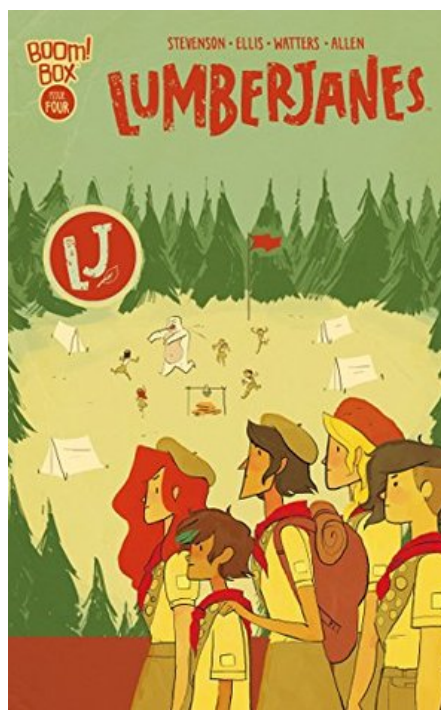

Lumberjanes #1-4 is collected in a book available at libraries.
