This is one of a series of preschool books featuring the lovable Gingerbread Man.

The story is told in poetic verse; this time the Gingerbread Man, and his preschool class, are off to the fire house. The Gingerbread Man gets lost but finds his way back after escaping from Spot, the station's Dalmatian.

He does so and takes the reader on a trip around the fire house. He:

- a. sees the children trying on boots, helmets, air tanks, and suits.
- b. sees the inside of the fire engine with its steering wheel, gauges, switches, and knobs.
- c. shimmies up the flag pole and sees where the fire fighters sleep.
- d. spies one of the firemen cooking dinner for everyone, (five-alarm chili and buttery rolls).

He even is instrumental in fighting a fire. I know children will enjoy seeing their hero help save the day!

It is a very sweet read and I am sure it will be a rousing success at storytime.

The only drawback for me is that I do not enjoy the illustrations. I know I am in a minority but that is why I did not give this book four stars.
