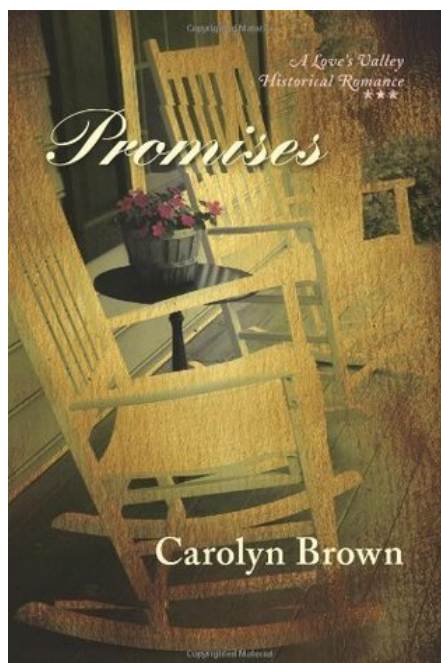




Promises
