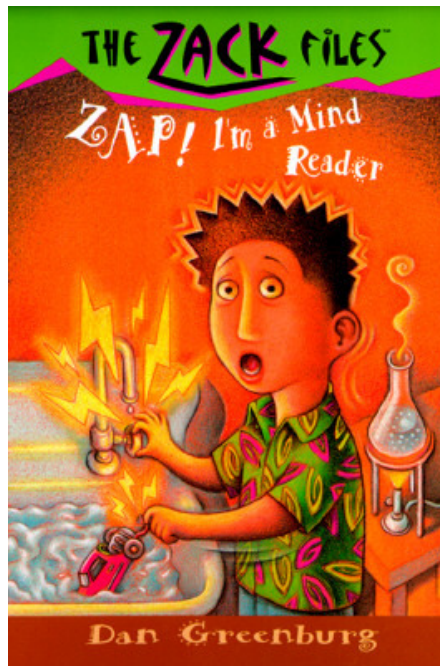




Zap! I'm A Mind Reader

In this one, Zack gets an electric shock and suddenly is able to hear thoughts, but he can't tell who/where they're coming from, so when he hears a mental voice bent on death and destruction, he doesn't know how to investigate or who to tell.

A note to parents. We read this with our Kindergartener and had to heavily edit parts of the story. Topics of Divorce, "psychopathic murderers," work done in a morgue, and phrases like "Kill, Kill, Kill." needed toned down for our sensitive K reader. He did enjoy the story, just be mindful of topics and language that you kids may be sensitive to.
