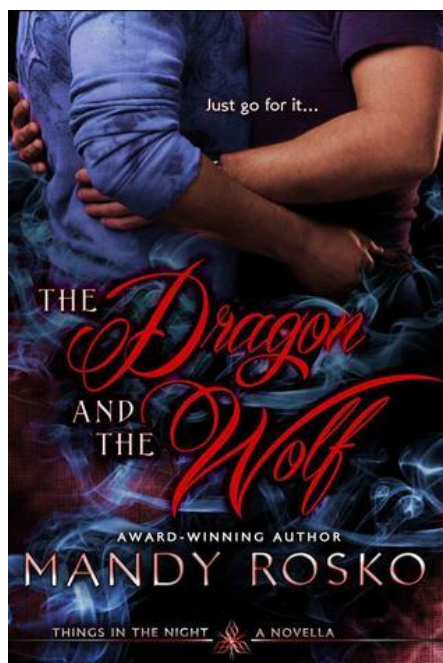




The Dragon and the Wolf

This was almost good. It started off well and remained good for about 2/3 of it. Then, seemingly out of nowhere, the pace skyrocketed, the romance popped into existence out of the ethers apparently, there was an almost sex scene (or rather, there was sex just no sex scene, leaving me feeling cheated) and then the whole thing just ended. It felt very much like the first couple chapters of a longer piece, as opposed to an actual short story.

I could try and excuse it as a prequel, but it's not the first in the series and the sequel is about another couple entirely. Which suggests to me that there isn't to be much more of Westley and Chris' story, even if they do happen to be in the next book.

The writing seemed pretty good, but it's a teaser at best.

Dragons and wolf shifters do not normally go along, but in this short prequel to 'The Legend of the Werewolf', Chris the dragon shifter and Westley the wolf shifter learn that there can be exceptions to the rule. It takes them a while to get there, and not everything is solved in this installment (leaving the real solution for the next book), but this story shows a very cute beginning of an unusual relationship.

Westley is under pressure to take a wife and produce pups for his pack, and since he's never told his father that he's gay, the man continues to push Annie (Westley's best friend) at him. When Westley meets Chris his reluctant resistance changes into open rebellion, since he now has a man to fight for.

Chris is a dragon shifter who has a history with wolves (and not a good one!), yet when he sees Westley being tortured by hunters, he rescues him without a second thought. The attraction that follows is unexpected, even unwelcome initially, but Chis deals with it a lot better than Westley. I loved the way he courts Westley, confusing the wolf, then making him uncomfortable - but it was necessary to wake Westley from his quiet acceptance and make him think about what he really wants.

As cute as this story is, you really do need to read "The Legend of the Werewolf" (an M/F book) to get the full story of Chris and Westley. They make a promising beginning here, and some interesting background of this version of the paranormal world is revealed, but I did miss a more definitive conclusion to their story. At least there is lots of hope and promise!
