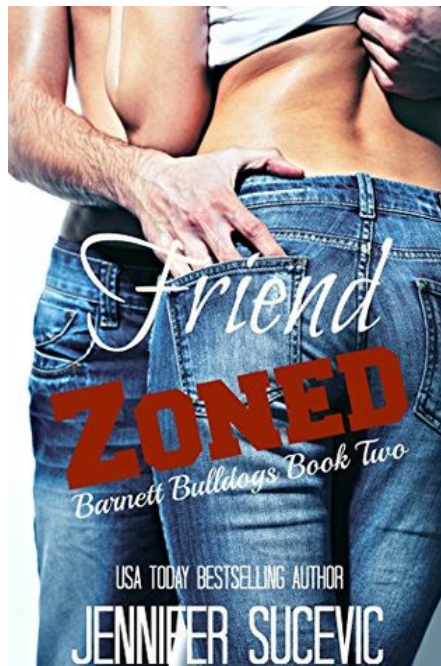




Friend Zoned
