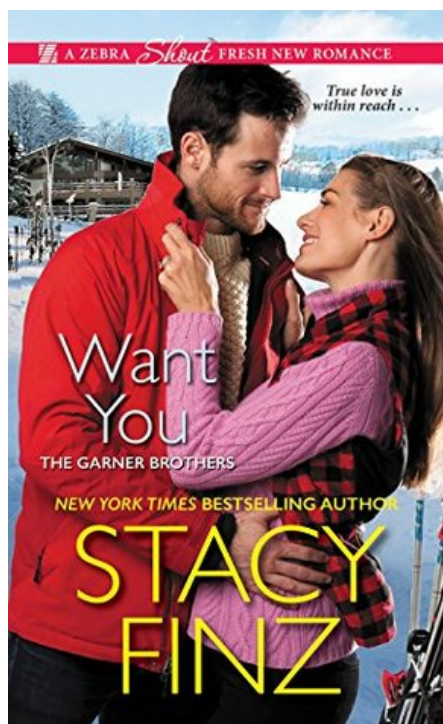

This is the second in the Garner Brothers series, and while I think it could work as a standalone, I think you'd miss a lot of the background flavor.

Both TJ and Deb have grown up in Glory Junction, and both are outdoorsy people. On the surface, though, that's where the similarities end. TJ is the workaholic, business-oriented Garner brother, at the expense of his own personal life. He has a certain vision for the company, and while he's helped make it wildly successful, he's not satisfied. Deb, on the other hand, works as a waitress at the local diner. Though they've each secretly had crushes on each other since they were kids, Deb believes TJ is too good for her, and TJ has avoided Deb because of her on-again-off-again relationship with his brother Win. When Deb confesses her money issues to TJ, he resolves to help her, but the main solution to her problem is that she needs to make more money. So, naturally, he offers her the management position for his family's company's new retail division – something she has no experience in.

“The entire business world operates under the premise that it's who you know, not what you know. No one passes on an opportunity because they have too much dignity to take a hand up. But if you want to live over a diner, drive a busted car, and eat ramen the rest of your life, suit yourself. The rest of us will happily use our connections to get ahead and prove ourselves.”

Deb is, understandably, shocked (as is the rest of TJ's family), but eventually takes the position, and then works her butt off trying to learn on the job. Luckily, she has a network of small business-owning friends (oh, and Delaney, the fashion designer from the previous book), so she's not going in completely blind. I was initially a bit skeptical of the whole premise, but Deb was an amazingly hard worker and had the advantage of being the type of person they wanted to advertise to. I was also a bit uncomfortable with the power dynamic – not only does TJ hire her for a job that's she desperately unqualified for, but he's also her direct boss. Partly because of this, by the time Deb and TJ finally get together, it's more than halfway through the book. They have several other external obstacles, as well, like pretty much everyone in town's assumption that Deb and Win will eventually end up together, and various characters shoving random women at TJ. Internally, Deb feels unworthy of TJ – I mean, her parents used to clean the company's office when she was a kid, so there's definitely a class divide. TJ, for his part, desperately wants to succeed but is also terrified of losing, to the point where he's either unwilling to try something for fear of failing or, if he does try something, gives up the minute it becomes too hard.

“Which reminds me, what are we doing for your birthday?” he asked.
“Getting drunk and then setting my car on fire.”
“I’ll bring the gin and marshmallows.”

We’re told that a lot of Deb’s financial situation is a result of her constantly bailing out her parents, and we do see it twice in the book – once at the beginning, where she ends up “loaning” them most of her tips so they can buy firewood, and again in the middle when they need help with a plumbing emergency. While having a much better paying job that includes benefits is sure to be a big help with dealing with that expense, I know from experience that that kind of responsibility is a mental as well as monetary burden. I would’ve liked to see that covered more. Instead, there seems to be a lot of time spent maneuvering other characters into possible relationships for further books in the series, including a pretty substantial subplot with Win. While I understood why some of this would need to be covered since everyone assumed that Deb and Win would eventually end up together, for me, it took too much time away from Deb and TJ. To be contrary, though, I did enjoy Deb’s relationships with her friends. Her conversations with Hannah, Foster, and Delaney were some of my favorite parts of the book.

Overall, while I had some issues with the book, I did enjoy it, and I’ll most likely be picking up the next book in the series! Recommended for fans of small-town, outdoorsy romances!

WANT YOU is the second book in The Garner Brothers series, and as much as I was looking forward to reading it, it didn’t grab me as much as I was hoping it would.

I liked TJ and Deb; they’re both very nice people who are hardworking and sacrifice for their families. But I didn’t love them, and quite often they annoyed me. TJ harbors quite a bit of jealousy towards his younger brother, Win, especially when it comes to Deb and his failed Olympic dream. He says he’s over losing his spot to Win, but clearly he’s not because he brought it up several times throughout the story. Deb has a very low opinion of herself and was constantly saying how she was never good enough, smart enough or sophisticated enough for someone like TJ.

Apart from the above—and that Deb is highly unqualified for the job TJ gives her—I don’t remember much else about them because Win stole the show, and not in a good way. Several scenes in this book are told from Win’s POV as he struggles with a personal matter, and it distracted from the story that really mattered, which is obviously TJ’s and Deb’s.

While **WANT YOU** is part of a series, it can easily be read as a stand-alone. The romantic relationship is a slow build, with TJ and Deb not having sex until the 74% mark. That’s not a bad thing; just something I thought worth mentioning. I felt the conflict was resolved too quickly, but it comes with a HEA and a sweet epilogue.

This is the second in the Garner brother series and while it could be read as a stand alone, I recommend starting the series at the beginning simply because I love these brothers and all their stories need to be read. Or read this one and then go back and read Colts story. Either way I am sure you will fall in love with these brothers.

I love the town of Glory Junction that this book is set around. A bustling adventure resort type town centered mostly around winter sports albeit not limited to it. This is funny because I hate everything about winter (typing this while it is snowing and freezing rain outside my window). I think it is the whole sense of community and vibe that has me smitten with the town.

Now to the actual story. The storyline with Deb and TJ is pretty typical. They have both secretly been in love with the other since high school however have stayed away from each other for their own reasons. The big one being Win, TJ's brother. With the tight family dynamic between the Garner brothers, this does pose to be a problem. As you know, these type of issues have a way of sorting themselves out throughout the pages of the story.

In this book we are told a story of a woman who has always thought she was not good enough for one Garner brother so settled for another. Out of desperation she asks the one person she usually tries to avoid, not because he's a bad guy but because she has always liked him and never thought she was in his league so she settled for Win, TJ for advise on her options. TJ helps because he's always liked her but she chose Win. When he sees just how bad her finances are he offers her a job to head the new retail division while she has no experience she is part of the target demographic and he trust her with the job.

But things aren't going smoothly as he hoped they would one of their major competitors also launched an

I have to wonder if author Stacy Finz realizes how selfish and self-centered and just plain dumb she made the Garner Brothers appear in the second book in their series Want You? Let's review. The entire Garner Family, dad, mom and all four brothers are partners in Garner Adventures which mom and dad founded some forty years ago. Dad and mom appear to be semi-retired and living a good life off the profits of the company. All four of the Garner brothers, Colt, the oldest and the full time sheriff of Glory Junction engaged to wealthy fashion designer Delaney Scott (first book Need You) T.J. who is the C.E.O. and the only one in the family who seems to put in a forty hour work week (and draws a big enough salary to afford a very expensive house on the water, speed boat and drive a luxury Range Rover), Josh (married to Hannah who runs a very successful retail store) and Wynn who work as guides which doesn't require them to put in a full work week. Now even though Josh and Wynn work as guides and make a decent living, we're told early on that our heroine Deb can make more money slinging hash at the local Morning Glory Diner than she can if she works for G/A as a guide. So even though Josh and Wynn make a decent living working as guides/co-owners of G/A apparently the company doesn't pay the rest of their guides a living wage.

Through out the book we keep reading about how the entire family has known Deb since she was a little girl and adore her. Yet through out the book we keep reading that if the retail business TJ convinced Deb to leave her job at Morning Glory to take doesn't do well, none of the Garners have any qualms about putting her out on her ass without a job because, well that's just business and we wouldn't want to cut into the family's profits. TJ tells her this while he worries over it even as he's paying large sums to the local hotel because a group that booked a tour with G/A caused some damage at the hotel. How again is that G/A's responsibility instead of the immature idiots who did the damage? Even as he decides to pay off a customer rather than allow their insurance company to fight his bogus claim and threaten him with a legal action if he unjustly slanders G/A on social media for his accident that was totally his fault. Even though he hires Deb because as a woman who is big into extreme outdoor activities and knows what their target demographic wants, right from the start he doesn't give her the authority she needs to make the decisions that experience would lead her to make that her future and that of their retail store is staked upon. Yeah Of course at the end we're supposed to believe TJ when he tells Deb she was never in danger of losing her job? How's that possible when the author made that threat a major dramatic part of the entire story almost from the start?

Colt whose primary income and job is as the town's sheriff and whose fiancée soon to be wife is not only one of the town's largest employers but also one of Deb's best friends almost from the time TJ hires her is pushing him to fire her? He'd put Deb out on the street with no job without a second thought to save her less than six figure salary. Because losing part of his additional income is more important than Deb losing her sole means of support. What a nice guy. Yeah, it's just business after all.

Then we have Wynn. At least Wynn is in Deb's corner. But then the author paints him as a nice if not very bright or mature man of thirty. Part of this story line is that Wynn who has dated Deb on and off since high school and whom everyone is sure will some day marry her when he finally grows up, believes he's knocked up a blackjack dealer from Reno who lives so far above her pay grade you'd think maybe she was a high priced call girl on the side. Does it ever cross Wynn's mind to question the paternity of the baby she's supposedly carrying even though he always used a condom and she claimed to be on the Pill when he had sex with her? Even though he realizes she's living far above her means? No. How dumb is this guy.

And as much as I loved Deb I've really got to wonder about her a little bit too. We find out early on that Deb has always had a thing for TJ but felt the high achiever was out of her league so she settles for this on again off again relationship with Wynn his underachieving little brother all through high school and then for ten years post high school. Why would you do that to yourself or Wynn if TJ is the guy you really want? And as it turns out ironically TJ has always been in love with her but she's made herself "hands off" to him because she's dating his younger brother. And Deb's parents aren't any prizes. Okay, so they've got some serious financial issues. But they've got no qualms with regularly hitting up Deb for money when she doesn't even make enough to support herself as a waitress living in a little dumpy apartment above the diner she works at. What kind of parents do that?

Honestly beyond Deb it seems like her BFF's Foster and Hannah (Josh's wife) and Delaney (Colt's fiancée) and Darcy G/A's receptionist/administrative assistant are the only totally likable characters in this story.

I wanted to love this book because I did love the first one where Colt was painted in a much better light. I kept trying to overlook all these issues I had with this story and enjoy it. But in the end as I did a mental review of the story in preparing to write this review, I just couldn't. I'll give it 3 Stars because I don't regret reading it but I really wish Ms. Finz hadn't made TJ and Colt seem like they cared more about a hit to their profits while they lived very well, than they did Deb's welfare and that whole drawn out deal where Wynn not once even questions whether he's the baby's father and no one in his family suggests a paternity test was just too hard for me to overlook.

The next book is Wynn and Darcy's. Since this is the Garner Brothers series and Wynn is the last unmarried brother, I have to think that ends the series. So along with the last unmarried Garner does, Rachel the owner of Tart Me Up or Karen, Delaney's assistant or Boden owner of the local watering hole find their H.E.A. in this book too? Seems like a lot to expect out of one book?

Deb Bennett is a woman struggling to survive with bills stacking up and her job not paying enough to keep up with them. So, when TJ Garner offers her an executive job at Garner Adventure, she can't say no. Not when the job will give her the chance to prove her worth and will have her working alongside TJ. However, working with the Garners is a blast and when she and TJ start to get closer, it's hard not to give into their intense chemistry. Will TJ and Deb be able to achieve their happy ever after, or will TJ lose Deb to the brother he believes she's always wanted?

Ms. Finz's books are always entertaining, and I really enjoyed this book because Deb is a down-on-your luck woman that finds her luck changing the moment TJ offers her a job; the hero begins to discover that work isn't all life should be about because of Deb; the dialogue was an enthralling combination of intense moments due to the main characters back stories and what the hero's brother is going through and playful banter that had me liking that TJ and Deb took a chance on each other; and the obstacles these two face to be together are tough, but I loved how they overcame them including whether the hero can do what the heroine wants to help with the company's online store and whether the hero realizes how good Deb is for him before he loses her.

Both the main characters were fascinating and I loved their back stories, as TJ has always been the responsible one and the best to lead the company while Deb has done everything she can to help her family and finds her efforts aren't enough. Moreover, the heroine is strong and brave in finally moving on from her off and on again relationship with TJ's brother and I liked that she finally took a chance on TJ because it's palpable how much he wants her. I also liked how hard-working she is and the brilliant ideas she comes up with to hopefully generate sales for the new venture of Garner Adventure. While the hero, he's charming, attentive and I liked that he would do anything to help someone in need, which is proven by how he helps Deb several times. Yet, what I liked most of all about the hero is the tight bond he shares with his family and that they would do anything for each other, even supporting one of the brothers that finds himself between a rock and a hard place when it comes to a woman that -- it's palpable -- is using Win for what he can give her.

There are lots of sweet moments between TJ and Deb while they navigate their intense attraction and unrequited teenage love. Unfortunately TJ lets his little brother's lust for Deb stop him from making his move sooner. Good on Deb though she doesn't let that influence him for long. She follows her own desires and doesn't apologize for going after TJ. Both characters are strong in their own right, but need help from each other to solve their own issues. It's this balance that Stacy writes so well. There is no one person as the Alpha in their relationship. It was refreshing to read. There also was no fight against what they felt once they were together, it was more of a fight about how to disclose their relationship to their family and friends.
