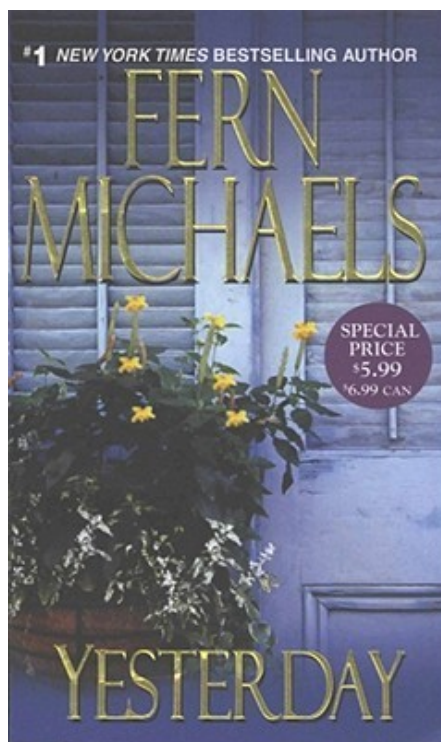




Yesterday
