Tempted by His Target is a fantastic book -- I ripped through it. Sometimes I think Harlequins are too short -- and I would have liked a little more understanding of Isabel's party girl past -- but this really was a great length, especially for a road-trip, cabin-romance book. Sorenson's characters are never cut-outs: they have quirks and real personality traits. Isabel and Brandon are capable, intelligent and they really really suit each other. They each have a streak of privacy and maturity that I so like.

Romantic suspense isn't a genre I read often but I'm glad I took *Tempted by His Target* off my TBR pile. The violence and scary aspects of their run to safety were real and omnipresent but so were the pockets of safety and relief. Mexico was a character too -- its landscapes, food and culture.

I'm a big fan of romantic suspense, and Sorenson has become one of my auto-buy authors, so when I saw her newest up on NetGalley, I didn't even bother reading the blurb before squeeing like a fangirl and requesting it.

Isabel is on the run in Mexico, dodging the cartel at every turn. She is hesitant around other people, so when the sexy Brandon comes sniffing around, she is reluctant to trust him. But he quickly gets under her skin and in her good graces and Isabel finds herself turning to him when things start to hit the fan.

Brandon has a secret, one he is desperate to keep from Isabel, especially since he needs to gain her trust. When he finds her in a pickle, he will do just about anything to keep her safe. As they travel through Mexico together, the two become more and more attracted to one another. These feelings are new to Brandon, and for the first time ever he might be willing to risk everything for a woman. But when Isabel learns his secrets, will she even want to accept what he has to offer?

What's more dramatic than a woman on the run, and the undercover US Marshal set to bring her in? I loved the story, and the setting especially. I love the Mexican culture and the way that Sorenson was able to bring so much life to the setting. I've always loved when a book's location can play such an integral part in the overall story, and I felt like Sorenson did an excellent job with that.

I really enjoyed the characters as well. I thought that Isabel was such a strong and incredible heroine. Although she had her moments of kicking ass, it was also obvious that she didn't want to do it, that she hated the violence that her life became, and I appreciated that. So many times in romantic suspense books, the heroine comes across as this incredible fighter and able to accomplish more than is realistic. That was not the case here, and I enjoyed that. Although there were times I wanted her to stop running and face everything she went through in life. When Isabel did finally get to that point, I was cheering for her, but wishing she had done so sooner.

From the moment Brandon stepped onto the page I was a fan. He was sexy and fun and one hundred percent dedicated to not only his job, but also the truth. I loved that he didn't take everything he heard and knew about Isabel as fact, and instead was constantly trying to get her side of the story, her version of what happened. On the run from a Mexican drug cartel, Isabel Sanborn now blends in with other surfers in Oaxaca. When her past catches up with her, however, she's rescued by Brandon Knox, a handsome surfer whose job as a self-defense instructor allowed him to step in at just the right moment and keep Isabel from being killed.

Teaming up with Brandon, they flee to Guatemala, determined to put some space between her and the thugs after her. Only, Brandon isn't really a tourist -- he's a U.S. Marshal working undercover to bring Isabel into custody. Keeping his true identity a secret, he forges an alliance with Isabel, and finds that running from the cartel is not the hardest part of his mission -- keeping his hands off of his beautiful, intriguing target is!

Overall, this was a fast paced, sexy read with just enough angst to keep things interesting. Isabel used to be a party girl, using sex, drugs, and a scandalous lifestyle to distract herself from the pain of her father's disinterest and then death, and since going on the lam, she has completely reinvented herself -- becoming a teetotaler and swearing off men -- and instead focuses on surfing and remaining under the radar.

Brandon knows that he can't have any sort of relationship with Isabel, and that his sole mission is to return her safely into custody in the U.S., yet he can't resist her beauty, both inside and out.

The sexual tension is incredible, with quite a few "false starts" into their sexual relationship, but the small number of times that they do manage to actually consummate their relationship were incredibly hot.

Recommended for fans of sexy undercover cops, beautiful heroines on the run, and a forbidden relationship that not even Witsec can prevent.

Isabel has been on the run for two years, from both the US authorities and a dangerous Mexican drug cartel. After spending most of her adult life jumping from party to party, drinking, and doing drugs, all to escape the disappointments in her life, being on the run has enabled her to clean up and reform her ways. Waking up next to the dead son of the cartel leader and having no idea of what happened, caused Isabel to flee in fear, and she has had to grow up a lot in the last two years. Brandon manages to make contact, despite her prickliness, and also gains her trust. However when members of the cartel find her they are forced to flee together. Brandon and Isabel grow close as they try to make their way through Mexico, Isabel begins to trust Brandon enough to tell him her story, and Brandon soon begins to wish he could help her rather than his eventual betrayal.

When I started reading this book I actually didn't like it. The use of a lot of surfer slang kind of put me off (!) and the hero was a little too young for my liking. The one-time party girl is being pursued for the death of a wealthy drug lord's son, and she's fled the US for little known beaches in Mexico. Now, it appears her pursuers have found her and will stop at nothing to capture her. Brandon, however, isn't about to give up his target. The fact that he is attracted to her makes his task more difficult, even to having thoughts of jeopardizing his mission.

The opening pulled me in, set on a beach, with the hero watching the heroine surf. (One movie I can watch over and over is Blue Crush). He may be the well-trained one but she can hold her own against the men after them. The setting is not a place we see often either. Although I've only been to Baja, Sorenson did a good job describing not only the landscape but the people and culture of the Oaxaca region. It was an enjoyable change of scenery.

Isabel Sanchez loves the ocean. It's one of the reasons she's living in this region of Mexico. She fled her life and the high living in LA when a night of drugs and loss of memory put her on the most wanted list of a dangerous man and the US government. But it's the drug lord that she's more afraid of since she thinks he wants her dead. Isabel Sanchez aka Izzy Sanborn has come a long way from the party girl she use to be. I liked how Izzy has transformed herself into a survivor. She still makes mistakes but her survival instincts have kicked in.

Brandon Knox is just a surfer, looking for the perfect wave when he shows up on the same beach as Izzy. A harmless tourist who just happens to teach self defense classes which explains why he's so good at saving Izzy from the men who are after her. Just like Izzy, I had no problem buying into this but when Brandon pulls out a gun and ammo, his story started to get shaky. His fear of Izzy bolting if she knew who he really was very genuine. The reason she's in Mexico is because she ran so there's no reason to believe she won't do it again but as they became closer and he thought of them having a life after she was safe, he should have come clean and trusted her.

The romance was an on-the-run romance which sometimes works and sometimes doesn't. This time it didn't fully work for me. I got the physical attraction part. Izzy and Brandon had no problem steaming things up, but the actually falling in love part is where I felt the story weakened. Since they were both lying to each other about who they were, it was hard to believe they actually fell for the real person. Too many lies in the way. Maybe if they had had a chance to fall in love after they were no longer on the run, it might have made it more believable.

The suspense runs fairly high with little down time. With Izzy knowing the country and how the drug cartels work, she proved to be a real asset to Brandon. At times, he played the muscle while she was the brains. Even with all of Brandon's training, Izzy was just as important a factor in keeping them alive as he was. (I liked that!) They did learn to work together quickly with part of that due to the fact that they didn't have much choice if they wanted to survive. There was still an air of mistrust between the two which made sense since neither was telling the full truth.

Tempted by His Target was a quick read with a lot of action. The romance seemed to be brought about by the physical attraction and driven by stressful circumstances. I did like the pacing of the story, I never got bored just wish I had believed more in the couple. Looking forward to reading Sorenson's full length novels.

I'm a huge Sorenson fan and when I first heard about her newest release I HAD to get my fingers on it. I love how she creates exceptionally multidimensional characters even in such a short format. Tempted by His Target shows us a world of corruption and deception in the middle of South America. We are thrown into a wild chase through this foreign world (at least for me) that shows us a different culture and in the middle of all this we find a heartbreaking romance.

Our heroine Isabel is on the run. In her past she made big mistakes and currently she's hiding from the results in the middle of nowhere, somewhere in Mexico. La Familia is after her so she tries to keep a low profile. Isabel changed a lot since she left everything behind. She matured and finally discovered who she is. She is strong and knows how to stay alive but still has this good spot deep inside that prevents her from being ruthless in gaining her freedom. I am a huge fan of Jill Sorenson's work. I love good romantic suspense and I think this is an author that knows how to write it. She has an amazing ability to create real and flawed characters that are likeable, and her sex scenes are scorching hot. So I was eager to read this book and while it wasn't my favorite of hers, it was an enjoyable and fast read.

Isabel Sanborn is a woman on the run. She used to be a privileged party girl hanging out with the wrong crowd. When she wakes up from a night of hard partying and finds her companion dead she flees the scene. The problem is that the dead guy happens to be the son of a Mexican drug lord, so now she lives in Mexico

as a fugitive hiding from the people who want revenge and from the law.

Brandon Knox is an undercover U.S. Marshall in charge of locating Isabel and bringing her to justice. Posing as a tourist he ends up saving Isabel's life and now they are on the run. She doesn't really know why he's helping her but since she needs him she accepts his help. What neither of them expects is the intense attraction they are both feeling, but for several obvious reasons they must fight that attractions before it gets them killed.

This was a very intense book, it isn't long but the action picks up almost from chapter one and it stays up until the very end. The scenery is beautiful and you can tell that Sorenson knows the places she describes because you can almost feel like you are there. By the end of the book I was seriously considering vacationing in Mexico.

My opinion of Isabel changed as the book kept progressing. At first I found her strong and likeable but once I read about her past and the reasons she was hiding she came across as immature and as a very bad decisions maker. I was a bit annoyed by her until I realized that she did a lot of growing up and she no longer was that spoiled brat. Granted, she does the growing up off-camera and that threw me off a bit, but by the end of the book I found her courage admirable, even though I still felt like she could have saved herself a lot of pain by making better choices. My main issue with her was that her journey from drug-addict party girl to level-headed woman on the run was mighty fast and quite unrealistic.

Brandon was a great hero because he finds himself in this difficult situation where he has a job to do but feels an intense attraction towards this woman and acting on it could jeopardize his job and their lives. He also suffered from a lack of maturity (he was young and fairly new to the job) and just like Isabel he made some wrong choices. One of my favorite things about Sorenson's books is that she manages to make the love story between young and immature characters, believable. I don't like romances where the lead characters are in their twenties, but in this case it worked and I could not only root for them but also believe in their happily ever after.

One particular issue that I had with the book –not so much a problem but something I would like to note– was that when I started the book I was unaware that Brandon was an U.S. Marshall (it says so on the blurb but I guess I forgot about it). Since he is quite vague about why he is after Isabel I spent more than half the book wondering if he was some type of bounty hunter hired by the drug lord and one of those bad guys turned good. Then there's the big reveal and everything gets straightened out, but that subplot (which might have been just part of my imagination and poor attention to detail) was quite interesting and suspenseful, so I wonder if having the blurb state what he really does for a living kind of hurts the book a bit and it might be a bit spoilerish.

I found the ending quite anticlimactic, I kept expecting something else to happen but it never did. I think that their journey wasn't so much about escaping from the bad guys as it was about Isabel coming to terms with what she did and realizing that she needed to confront the consequences of her actions. This makes for a fairly realistic plot with a rather boring ending that left me wanting just a bit more (although there's a very hot sex scene near the end to compensate for it).

Overall this was another great story by an author that has become one of my favorites when it comes to romantic suspense. I think every fan of the genre will like this book and even though I had some complains about the plot and it took me a bit to warm up to the characters I ended up enjoying it and I think you will too.
