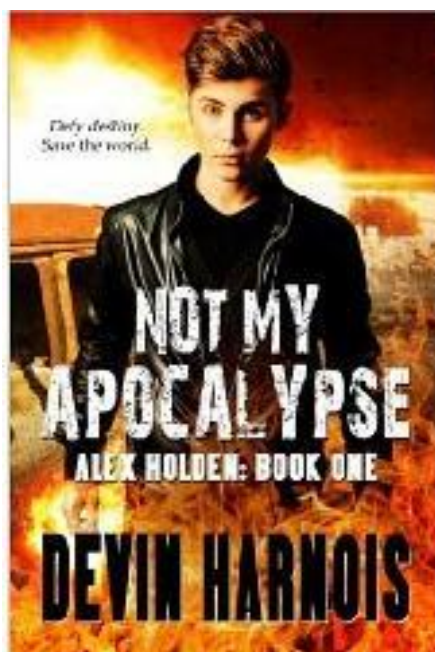




Not My Apocalypse

I'm on the fence about how many stars to give this book. There were some slightly interesting explorations of morality, which were handled pretty gracefully. The action was fairly standardized and video-game-esque, but not terrible. There was a ton of profanity, so much that it intruded a little into my reading experience (not the dialog so much, but the narration itself), but it wasn't offensive, just annoying. In short, the book was a middle-of-the-road teenage adventure. I'm sure many people will love it, and many will hate it.

Two criticisms: The first is that the book jumps right into the story on page 1 without introducing any of the characters, building up any background on them or creating any empathy for them with the reader. It needed to slow down just a bit and make us care about Alex and his friends.

The second is the use of the word 'f*ck'. It's everywhere. It appears multiple times a page. Now, I know how teens talk when adults aren't around and I swear myself. But, please. It was excessive. If you're going to swear, do so with a little care and maybe mix it up a bit. I'm sure he knows other swear words. A little goes a long way and a lot just gets in the way.

In this story we meet Alex Holden, the Anti-Christ. He is still a teenager being home schooled by his Satanist mother and step father. Alex is fully aware of his fate, and who his real father is and he wants no part of it. Not My Apocalypse is a modern mythological tale that blends Greek, Norse mythology with Christian Deities.

Alex teams up with the sons and daughters of the Greek and Norse Gods and even with the second coming form of Jesus, Joshua, in a series of battles to save the world from total destruction.

I will caution readers that Alex uses profanities to the point that I found it distasteful. Also there is a lot of domestic violence.

Yet over all it was a decent read.

Due to the Excessive use of profanities, and the child abuse that Alex suffers at the hands of his father, Satan, I would not recommend this book to readers under the age of 17.

However, I feel that adult readers of modern myth-fiction, and action adventure may enjoy reading it.
